#### PRESIDENT'S REPORT 2020/2021

2021 marked the 150<sup>th</sup> arrival of HMVS Cerberus in Port Phillip, an event that was celebrated by the issuing of an Australia Post postage stamp, medallion, first day cover etc. In conjunction with representatives from the Royal Australian Navy (R.A.N.), Heritage Victoria, the City of Bayside, the Black Rock Yacht Club and descendants of Captain Panter, we unveiled the stamp in Black Rock Yacht Club overlooking Cerberus in Half Moon Bay.

The unveiling ceremony enabled us to re-establish contact with the City of Bayside, meet the new Senior Maritime Archaeologist of Heritage Victoria and to meet the R.A.N.'s Senior Naval Officer in Victoria, in person. #### VICE PRESIDENT'S REPORT 2020/21

Over the last 18 months I have taken on the role of memberships in addition to preparation and mailing of online stores orders and maintaining the social media content for *Friends of the Cerberus*. The role of memberships comprises updating members details in addition to sending out renewal notices/invoices for each fiscal year. Our social media pages require constant attention and responses where appropriate to members posts.

#### Facts Associated with the Role - 2020/21

#### Membership: (<u>https://www.cerberus.com.au/friendss.html</u>)

Membership is for each financial year (1 July till 30 June) with a renewal notice/invoice sent during the first half to anyone who was a full (financial) member in any of the preceding three years and hasn't yet renewed.

Our overall membership *(including associates)* increases every year and at the end June 2021 was in excess of 700 individuals and organisations.

Online Store: (<u>https://www.cerberus.com.au/store/store.html</u>)

A wide range of products are available from our online store which at times does a brisk trade in everything from promotional bumper stickers and baseball caps to historic reproductions such as sailors' caps, ship's plans, operations manuals, card models etc. We even have a range of prints by renowned Australian artists. All items are protected against water damage in case they are left sticking out of a letter box or laying against an exposed front door in the rain.

Postage rates have increased substantially in Australia over the past 17 years (since establishment of the online store) and likely most other places as well. Nevertheless Friends of the Cerberus has thus far kept such charges unchanged, certainly during the time I have been handling the stores orders which is almost all of that period.

#### Social Media - Facebook:

Our primary social media presence is through Facebook and for some time now I have been recruited to assist with maintaining our Page and public Group. The page is a relatively early addition to our promotional 'toolbox'. The group was generously created (and an initial following built up) by one of our keen supporters.

**Page** (<u>https://www.facebook.com/hmvscerberus</u>) - 950 followers demonstrates a relentless increase in support for our social media 'showpiece'. Supporters from all over the world regularly frequent our page and many also join the group (*below*). At times we have seen visitors from around 50 countries browse posts and links during the course of a month. Currently the top 10 countries providing visitors to our page are Australia, USA, Egypt, Spain, UK, Italy, India, Brazil, Peru and France. #### SECRETARY'S REPORT 2020/21

#### TREASURER'S REPORT 2020/2021

The year 2020/2021 saw another financial year of little activity for *Friends of the Cerberus*.

Overall we had an <u>increase</u> of funds of \$2,086.08. Income was \$4,214.00 and expenses \$2,127.92 providing an end of year balance at the bank of \$3,803.14. In my view this may possibly paint an embellished picture of our financial status as it was achieved on the back of a once off donation of \$2,204.50 I received n June. Take away that donation and we actually had a <u>decrease</u> in funds of -\$76.58 and a substantially reduced amount of income for the year of only \$2,010. Fortunately, the donation was received in the last month of the financial year and we were able to still be "in the black".

As with last year, 2019/20, we can attribute the low income to a number of factors including: current state of economic activity within the community due to the pandemic; demographics of our membership; accumulation of savings rather than spending (on memberships); and the decision still fresh in members minds to grant a permit to fill Cerberus with concrete that had an extremely negative impact on members. Low income does tend to curb the activities and ability of Friends to lobby other levels of Government and to initiate reports/investigations.

Trends over the past few financial years have seen a decrease in revenue/income sources since 2016/17 with the 2017/18 year seeing our lowest income ever received. Regretfully, in 2020/21 there was no income for 7 months of the fiscal year and income from memberships - subs, ranks and donations - was buoyed by the substantive donation received in June.

Over the last 18 months I have taken on the role of memberships in addition to preparation and mailing of online stores orders and maintaining the social media content for *Friends of the Cerberus*. The role of memberships comprises updating members details in addition to sending out renewal notices/invoices for each fiscal year. Our social media pages require constant attention and responses where appropriate to members posts.

#### Facts Associated with the Role - 2020/21

#### Membership: (<u>https://www.cerberus.com.au/friendss.html</u>)

Membership is for each financial year (1 July till 30 June) with a renewal notice/invoice sent during the first half to anyone who was a full (financial) member in any of the preceding three years and hasn't yet renewed.

Our overall membership *(including associates)* increases every year and at the end June 2021 was in excess of 700 individuals and organisations.

Online Store: (<u>https://www.cerberus.com.au/store/store.html</u>)

A wide range of products are available from our online store which at times does a brisk trade in everything from promotional bumper stickers and baseball caps to historic reproductions such as sailors' caps, ship's plans, operations manuals, card models etc. We even have a range of prints by renowned Australian artists. All items are protected against water damage in case they are left sticking out of a letter box or laying against an exposed front door in the rain.

Postage rates have increased substantially in Australia over the past 17 years (since establishment of the online store) and likely most other places as well. Nevertheless Friends of the Cerberus has thus far kept such charges unchanged, certainly during the time I have been handling the stores orders which is almost all of that period.

#### Social Media - Facebook:

Our primary social media presence is through Facebook and for some time now I have been recruited to assist with maintaining our Page and public Group. The page is a relatively early addition to our promotional 'toolbox'. The group was generously created (and an initial following built up) by one of our keen supporters.

**Page** (<u>https://www.facebook.com/hmvscerberus</u>) - 950 followers demonstrates a relentless increase in support for our social media 'showpiece'. Supporters from all over the world regularly frequent our page and many also join the group (*below*). At times we have seen visitors from around 50 countries browse posts and links during the course of a month. Currently the top 10 countries providing visitors to our page are Australia, USA, Egypt, Spain, UK, Italy, India, Brazil, Peru and France. You can help grow this community by inviting your Facebook friends to like/follow us by following the above web address.

**Group** (<u>https://www.facebook.com/groups/45168765147</u>) - With membership approaching 700 the group has shown strong growth and enthusiastic engagement by supporters, notably over the past 6 months. The group currently enjoys about 40% of members active during any given month. Anyone can join the group and any member can approve others to join, post and comment. Check it out at the above web address.

#### General Commentary - Website:

Our main website at <u>https://www.cerberus.com.au</u> is an extensive depository of all things even remotely associated with Cerberus, notably the Victorian colonial navies. Unfortunately you will have noticed of late that our news ticker which used to present links to our news items has been disabled. Our President and primary researcher who built and maintains the site assures me that the information is secure but he is increasingly doubtful that the ticker can be restored due to issues beyond my technical understanding. At some stage in the future we may be able to provide an alternative on the website but in the interim please visit our Facebook sites and like/follow/join to participate in a community information exchange on the subject (*refer to "Social Media - Facebook" above*).

I have enjoyed my enhanced role in servicing our members together with the Committee and look forward to the next 12 months.

#### SECRETARY'S REPORT 2020/21

#### TREASURER'S REPORT 2020/2021

The year 2020/2021 saw another financial year of little activity for *Friends of the Cerberus*.

Overall we had an <u>increase</u> of funds of \$2,086.08. Income was \$4,214.00 and expenses \$2,127.92 providing an end of year balance at the bank of \$3,803.14. In my view this may possibly paint an embellished picture of our financial status as it was achieved on the back of a once off donation of \$2,204.50 I received n June. Take away that donation and we actually had a <u>decrease</u> in funds of -\$76.58 and a substantially reduced amount of income for the year of only \$2,010. Fortunately, the donation was received in the last month of the financial year and we were able to still be "in the black".

As with last year, 2019/20, we can attribute the low income to a number of factors including: current state of economic activity within the community due to the pandemic; demographics of our membership; accumulation of savings rather than spending (on memberships); and the decision still fresh in members minds to grant a permit to fill Cerberus with concrete that had an extremely negative impact on members. Low income does tend to curb the activities and ability of Friends to lobby other levels of Government and to initiate reports/investigations.

Trends over the past few financial years have seen a decrease in revenue/income sources since 2016/17 with the 2017/18 year seeing our lowest income ever received. Regretfully, in 2020/21 there was no income for 7 months of the fiscal year and income from memberships - subs, ranks and donations - was buoyed by the substantive donation received in June.
